

Fee schedule, rules and regulations:

Consignment fees: Horses: \$75, *includes Catalog fee*. Wheeled vehicles: \$25, Small fee, determined by Auction Office on tack.

Commissions: 8% horses, 10% vehicles, 20% tack.
Minimum \$25 commission per horse.

- No pass out fee. Consignor has option of accepting or rejecting final bid. **All** sales must go through auction office.
- Consignment and Catalog deadline is **5 PM MONDAY** prior to auction. There are **NO** exceptions to this rule.
- Consigning early is in your best interest.
- Late consignments = late numbers.
- Website advertising available at additional \$20 per horse.
- Also due Monday prior to auction. Consignments accepted by mail, fax or email only when accompanied by payment. Email preferred format for catalog texts, pedigrees.
- **Original, Negative Coggins test dated within 6 months required by MA law with every horse.**
- There will be NO Substitutes. Horses sold in Catalog order. Horses not cataloged will sell last.
- Your horse is cataloged for the benefit of advertising that horse, thus giving everyone a fair opportunity to bid. Once your horse is consigned, advertised and cataloged, it is in your best interest to bring him to the auction. There will be NO refunds or any consignment services provided for any reason.

Health Certificate Notice:

Attention Out-of-State Horse Customers and Consignors!!

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts will be strictly enforcing Health Certificates on all out-of-state horses. All out-of-state consignments MUST be accompanied by a health certificate in addition to their Coggins dated within 6 months to be included in the auction.

To allow our out-of-state buyers to continue to purchase desired horses and comply with MA laws, we have arranged for a veterinarian to be at the auction from 4:00-5:30 pm on Sunday.

All horses sold on Sunday that will be leaving Massachusetts MUST be examined by the vet on premises before they will be allowed to leave.

Each health certificate will cost new owners \$75, with additional horses listed on that certificate for \$10 per horse.

Please pass the message to any and all contacts you know will be coming to the auction on Sunday.

Again: Heritage Farm has arranged to have a veterinarian on the property to follow the laws strictly enforced by Massachusetts.

Lot: Any item or items of merchandise, personal property, horse, pony or other livestock offered for sale.

***Admission** to Heritage Farm and to any sale, auction or other event held there is free. Buyers, sellers, spectators and the general public are hereby informed that Management specifically disclaims liability to anyone for any accident, loss, damage or occurrence, no matter how caused.

***Management** does not act as agent for or represent either buyer or sell. It simply provides a medium for bringing together buyer and seller for the purpose of negotiating and effecting a sale.

*All lots are sold “as-is, where-is”; any representation or guarantee exists between buyer and seller. Management offers no implied or express warranty of merchantability or suitability for any purpose on any lot or lots. It specifically does not guarantee age, height, soundness or health of any livestock.

***Each** consignor retains the option of accepting or rejecting the final bid on any lot. However, in fairness to the potential buyer, the seller’s decision should be announced before the lot leaves the auction ring.

***Buyers** agree to pay for all purchases with cash or good check if such check is accepted by Management. Credit card privileges are offered to qualified buyers, with a 3% surcharge on all credit card purchases. Management may accept, in selected instances, a suitable deposit on a lot with full payment to be made by the second business day after the sale. Buyers are expected to make any arrangements other than full cash payment with Management prior to bidding on any lot.

***No** payment is to be made to any individual consignor for any lot. All payments are to be made solely through the sale office. Risk and responsibility for any lot will pass to buyer immediately upon being sold by the auctioneer. Title to and possession of any lot shall not pass, nor may any lots be removed from the premises until all invoices and charges are paid. A paid receipt is needed as proof.

***Management** will try to assist buyers and sellers in obtaining horse transportation to and from this sale if asked. Horses purchased here may be left overnight without charge, but solely at the buyer’s risk. A \$20 per night fee will be charged for animals left for longer periods.

Lot 994: Bandit, 15 YO grade Morgan gelding, 15 hh. Bandit is very outgoing, friendly and attractive! He’s a people horse that is bright, alert and eager to please. He rides nicely, is responsive and happy to go without being asked twice. He has comfortable gaits, polite manners and is pretty to look at even on days when it’s too cold to ride.

Lot 995: Ernie, 5 YO Bay QHX gelding, 16hh. Ernie is a nice looking, nice moving horse with a laid-back attitude. He’s good in the ring but loves trail riding. He’s an easy keeper, very polite in the barn. A nice young horse with a bright future.

Lot 996: Obie, 15 YO red & white pinto gelding, 16.2hh. Tall, well-colored pinto who has been a trail horse. Circumstances changed and his previous owners can no longer accommodate horses.

Lot 997: Brody, 6 YO, Welsh cob gelding, 13.2 hh. Brody is a great little guy, He has always shown a good attitude and a lot of personality, He gets along with every horse he meets will stand on cross ties safe for lead line, could use more than a beginner rider. has done some local showing and trail riding will hop a cross rail traffic safe trailers great. good for farrier and vet. has been a pleasure to have around. —*Isabelle White*

Lot 998: Isabelle (aka Izzy), 7 APHA paint mare, 16.1hh. —*Jaelyn Hecht*

Lot 999: Remington, 9 YO, brown and white pinto gelding, 16.1hh. Remington is a great all around pleasure horse. quiet to work around gets along great with every horse rides English and Western down the trail and roads. stands for vet and farrier. He has been boarded with us for a year now and has been a pleasure to have around. This big beautiful gelding would make a great addition to any barn and has unlimited potential. —*Isabelle White*

Lot 1000: Scout, Teenaged paint gelding, 16.2. Scout was a lesson horse for a while but has been a pasture ornament for the past few years. He is uncomplicated and can carry riders of all sizes.

Lot 987: Harmony, 10 YO grade dun gelding, 15.1 hh. Harmony is a bright and happy horse who is always ready for an adventure. He has been ridden English and Western, inside and out. He's very straightforward; he goes wherever you point him. He's a pretty mover with comfortable gaits, especially a great lope that has makes him popular with many riders at our barn.

Lot 988: Blaze, 11 YO chestnut gelding, 15.1hh. Sound, gentle, well behaved, well schooled. Rides Western or English. Fine in or out of ring, has jumping experience also.

Lot 989: Golden Glitter TE (aka Cash), AQHA gelding foaled May 3, 2002, 15.2 hh. "Cash" spent several years working on Ken McNabb's Diamond M Ranch in Wyoming and rides like a smart and handy horse from that work. He has more buttons than a spaceship! He has spent the last year as a backyard trail horse with much of the winter off. He is a cool horse that can go from here on any trail ride or to a show ring.

Lot 990: Segar, 12 YO Appendix gelding 16.3hh. Segar is handsome, kind, sane, and very sensible under saddle, and he is a perfect gentleman on the ground. He is happy to work in the ring or hack out down the trail. His easy-going nature and three well-balanced gaits make him a suitable lesson horse. However, his movements and flashy appearance will land him in the blue in the show ring. —*James Borden*

Lot 991: Warren, 11 YO bay gelding, 16.1 hh. This very nice gelding has been working in a recently closed college riding program. Warren is sound and useful, will jump a course, and has lead changes. He's just too big of a horse for the young riders at his old barn.

Lot 992: Vicar In The House, 14 YO chestnut Thoroughbred gelding, 16.2hh. Handsome chestnut gelding with a big white blaze. Beautiful mover. —*Hannah Remillard*

Lot 993: Smoky, Grey gelding, 9yrs 14.1 h. A very attractive, friendly, and well made little horse that has been ridden outside a bunch. He makes a great "package" in english or western tack, and he has the potential to be "special" for someone looking to get riding this spring!

Lot 894: Rio, 9 YO medium POA gelding. Rio is a very handsome, comfortable and simple pony gelding that is quickly becoming a barn favorite- the girls all ask to ride him! He takes 2 leads, is a pretty mover and is fun over poles, small jumps and with silly obstacles to keep everyone entertained! Teeth done 11-19, easy keeper, ready to go!

Lot 895: Sparky, Bay grade QH geld 15h 11yrs. Sparky is a very nice horse who was used as a ranch horse in Kansas. He will never question his rider, and will try his heart out to please. He is the kind of horse that seems harder and harder to find. Great guest or husband horse, good in the ring and perfectly at home on trails.

Lot 896: Thomas the Horse, AQHA gelding foaled April 23, 2007, 15.2 hh. Thomas is a handsome, very well broke horse that is easy to ride. He is great in the ring and outside on trails. He's quiet enough for a kid, but a good sized horse to carry a grown man too.

Lot 897: Kingwood Drift (aka Drifter), AQHA gelding foaled May 21, 2006, 15.1 hh. Drift is as solid as a rock. He is virtually unflappable under saddle and rides outside with a businesslike attitude. He is nicely broke in the ring, tolerant and fun for bareback, games, and general winter goofiness. Drift has pleasant manners and is a nice all around horse to have in the barn!

Lot 898: Tommy, Sorrel QH gelding, 15.1h, 7YO Tommy is the kind of horse that seems to be very hard to find. As a four and five year old he was used by a young man for general day work on a small ranch. Dad then took him over and he rode him once in a while, either on the ranch sorting pairs or down to the local arena where he did a little of everything, but mostly hung out with his cronies and talked about the old days. Tommy will watch a cow, lope nice circles in the arena, and outside he will cross bridges, creeks, logs and work any kind of gate he is asked. Above all, he is SAFE AND GENTLE for all levels of riders and just seven, not seventeen. If you were to google 'using horse', there should be Tommy's picture.

Lot 899: Another Chip, AQHA gelding foaled May 7, 2003, 16.1 hh. Chip is more than a Cadillac, he's a Coup de Ville. He is a tall, handsome, big bodied horse with a big heart and beautiful face. Chip is impeccable to ride inside or outside, English or Western, for a child or an adult. He's a pretty mover and is broke, adjustable and FUN!! There is not a better horse to own than this sweet guy; he's that one in a million horse we all search for!! He is a favorite in our barn and will be in yours too!!

Lot 900: Charmer, 11 YO Paint/Warmblood gelding, 16.2hh. Sound, handsome, has fox hunted with hounds, more of a push ride in the ring.

Lot 977: Mr. P, Mr. P is a 15.3 hand, 15 yr old gelding. Always sound. Always a gentleman. Rides English or western. He jumps a small course of jumps. He is super smooth and loves the trails. He has always been good for the greener riders, but he enjoys a better rider as much as anybody else. He really just wants to please his people. —*Kate Harris*

Lot 978: Hamilton, Hamilton, 6 YO TB gelding, 16.1 hh. Hamilton has been leased by a teenaged rider whose riding time is limited by high school so must end her lease. He is a sweet, friendly gentleman of a horse that has good manners in the barn and under tack. He's got a great start to him, has been working honestly over fences all spring and summer and been trail ridden. He has been trailered to several shows, is as quiet and sane away as he is at home, and does his job with zero prep or lengthy formula to success. He has a fantastic, well balanced canter and is getting solid on lead changes. He gets along with a herd of geldings in turn out and is kid safe to groom, feed or handle. Hamilton is a mild cribber in his stall if he does not wear a cribbing strap, but does not crib while turned out even without the strap.

Lot 979: WF Touch Ofbrownsugar (aka Pedro), gelding foaled April 12, 2008, 16 hh, TRIPLE REGISTERED as ApHA, Buckskin and Pinto registries. Pedro is a FANCY gelding with great manners. He's classy and very well trained. He looks great in Western tack plus has an effortless way of going which helps him look ideal in English tack also. Pedro is polite, pretty and popular with everyone in our barn.

Lot 980: Razz A Mah Tazz (aka Lemon), AQHA gelding foaled July 31, 2007, 16 hh. Lemon is well made with a kind eye and good mind. He is exceptionally well broke, rides off the seat and leg and has that elusive true one-handed neck rein. Lemon is responsive without being reactive and has a good workmanlike attitude towards every task. He rides well inside, outside, under saddle or bare back and even without a bridle with the right rider! He is sweet, friendly but humble and a pleasure to be around.

Lot 981: HG Chicks N Chills (aka Joey), AQHA gelding foaled April 2, 2012, 16.1 hh. "Joey" is a happy, outgoing, friendly, easy going and well started young gelding. He is sound, leggy, well balanced and very simple to ride. He's definitely a push along ride that has been lightly started over pole work and fences this winter. He absolutely loves attention and people, rides alone or in a group, has been trailered and schooled off the farm where he was just as safe, sane and laid back as he has been at home. He has no quirks, loves playing with other horses in turnout and is polite and gentle to groom, tack and ride. This young registered horse could be show ring ready by spring!

Lot 982: Harmony Ridge's Danny Boy, 10 YO dark bay registered Tennessee Walking Horse gelding, 16hh. Danny is a big bodied, well put together Tennessee Walker. He has a flashing and smooth running-walk. However, he will trot and his canter is one of the smoothest you will ever ride. He is a gentleman both on the ground and under saddle. He works in the ring and loves to go down the trail. Fun and safe to work with and around. —*James Borden*

Lot 983: Sinsthebluespride (aka Blue), AQHA gelding foaled June 16, 2009, 15 hh. Blue is a stocky made horse that can carry a small or larger rider. He has a nice and forward, though not fast, way of going that you can ride and enjoy all day! He is as friendly as a pet pig and VERY gentle.

Lot 984: Obvious Resolution, AQHA gelding foaled March 15, 2013, 15 hh. This handsome young fellow is a very sweet horse that is as cute as a bug. He is a FANTASTIC mover with a wonderful canter. He's got a solid start in the ring and is great outside which makes him an ideal prospect to go on from here and be finished in any discipline you choose.

Lot 985: Kota, 12 YO red dun gelding, 15.2hh. Sound, broke, easy to ride, had been in parades and on trails. Previous owner aged out of riding, he is ready for a next family!

Lot 986: Wyatt, 11 YO palomino Quarter Horse gelding, 14.1 hh. W/T/C and jumps courses. Quiet, clips, loads, good for farrier. Shown successfully and loves trail rides! —*Joan Abbate*
